


GLSEN's LGBT Safe Schools Initiative

GLSEN has entered into a five-year partnership with the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) on the critical mission of improving the health outcomes of youth at highest risk for HIV and STDs. This work is founded on the association between hostile school environments and increased risk taking, which disproportionately impacts LGBT youth, particularly LGBT youth of color. The LGBT Safe Schools Initiative is focused on ensuring that each school provides a safe and welcoming environment where all students, regardless of sexual orientation or gender identity/expression, can fully participate in the learning process and have the opportunity to reach their potential. We will achieve this by applying our twenty years of experience and evidence-based resources to developing the capacity of 18 school districts across the country to implement policies and train staff members to create schools where all students can thrive.

RESEARCH SAYS

- 8 out of 10 LGBT students experience verbal, physical or sexual harassment in their school because of their sexual orientation*
- Nearly 1 out of 2 LGBT students felt unsafe because of their sexual orientation*
- More than 1 out of 3 LGBT students felt unsafe because of their gender expression*
- Between 2006-2009, HIV infection rates increased 34% among young MSM (men who have sex with men) overall, and 48% among young, black MSM specifically**
